Re: Kenilworth Green

I am extremely concerned to hear that the council has included the patch of amenity land known as Kenilworth Green within a list of potential sites for redevelopment for alternative use. Clearly, the "*alternative*" would be residential development. I live at 122 Kenilworth Avenue (the last house in the road and on the corner of Home Park Road) and so face Kenilworth Green directly. Any development would affect us very greatly. To describe it as a "vacant site", as it is described in the document Site Proposal No. 30 Part ii, is quite misleading. It is not vacant at all, it is an amenity green space much used and loved by the local residents and providing a welcome "lung" in an already over developed area. The council already allowed, despite strong objection, a residential site to be developed to one end of Kenilworth Green on Home Park Road and as that property is now divided into at least two dwellings the pressure on parking etc. has become even more intense. The Green currently is a welcome space with trees, shrubs and seating where local people meet, particularly young people. There are few such spaces in the area and the only one that is always "open". It would be a highly retrograde step to consider any type of development of the site and it should be retained exactly as it is.
